Perennials for Sunny Spots

Perennial plants that want more than 6 hours of sun a day All plants in this section are in 1-gallon pots unless noted otherwise.

Yarrow

Achillea 'Moonshine' \$12.00

For sunny, hot, dry sites, yarrow is a proven performer. Popular with butterflies and bees but not with deer, this yellow hybrid introduced in the 1950s features silvery foliage and gets almost 3' tall. Great as a cut or dried flower.



Agapanthus

Agapanthus 'Galaxy White' \$12.00

This winter hardy cultivar produces clusters of pure white flowers in late summer. Similar in form to the spring flowering alliums this will reach 40" tall.



Anise Hyssop

Agastache 'Blue Fortune' \$12.00

These 30" tall spires of blue flowers are popular with butterflies and bees. This drought tolerant plant has fragrant foliage and blooms from mid-summer into the fall.





Wormwood

Artemesia 'Silver Mound' \$ 12.00

A low mounding, silvery foliage plant that looks great on the edge of a garden path. Does not need a lot of watering and is deer resistant.



Swamp Milkweed

Ascelpias incarnata \$ 12.00

This native wetland perennial does well in moist soils and rain gardens. It is a host plant for Monarch butterfly caterpillars but attracts many other pollinators as well. It features a cluster of upturned deep pink flowers that bloom mid-summer.



Butterfly Weed

Asclepias tuberosa \$ 12.00

Bright orange flowers attract all sorts of butterflies and of course it is a host plant for Monarch butterflies. The plant itself grows about 24" tall and is a rugged performer in the summer garden. May be late coming out in the spring.



Aster

Aster novae-angliae 'Purple Dome' \$ 12.00

This tried-and-true aster is a great flower to have in the fall. This native cultivar is compact, growing only to 18" or so. Attracts butterflies and bees late into the season.



Aromatic Aster

Aster oblongifolius 'Raydon's Favorite' \$12.00

Medium blue flowers bloom in early fall. Aromatic foliage that grows to 3' tall. It does well in dry sunny spots and is deer resistant.





False Indigo

Baptisia australis \$ 12.00

Blue spikes bloom in May and are a great transition bloomer in mid to late spring. Growing 3-4' tall, this is a good plant for the middle or back of the flower bed and the leaves make a great back background for other plants.

Baptisia 'American Goldfinch' \$12.00

A big plant with bright color that will make a statement in any garden. This is a heavily flowering yellow cultivar of our native false indigo.



Threadleaf Coreopsis

Coreopsis verticillata \$ 12.00

Bright yellow flowers sprawl across the tops of soft, fine foliage and make a stunning show midsummer. This native grows to about 24" tall and is drought tolerant. Popular with all sorts of pollinators.



Tickseed

Coreopsis 'Red Satin' \$ 12.00

A red selection of the threadleaf coreopsis that makes a great accent. A little more compact than the straight species, it will grow to about 18" tall and wide.

Montbretia

Crocosmia 'Lucifer' \$12.00

Tall sword-like leaves make this plant a spiky vertical element in garden design and the red blooms on wiry stems just add to that. It will get 36" tall, but only about 12" wide. The red tubular flowers are attractive hummingbirds. It loves full sun but can tolerate some light shade.





Purple Coneflower

Echinacea purpurea 'Magnus' \$ 12.00

A North American native great for attracting insects and birds to your garden. Growing 36" tall, it is topped with large purple daisy-like flowers in late summer. Adaptable to most situations as long as it gets plenty of sun.



Purple Coneflower

Echinacea purpurea 'Ruby Star' \$12.00

This cultivar is shorter than the species with large flowers that are a deep purple pink, almost red.



Joe-Pye Weed

Eupatorium dubium 'Little Joe' \$ 12.00

This compact cultivar of the native perennial (3-4' tall) features clusters of pink purplish flowers in late summer. It likes moist places and attracts a variety of pollinators including many butterflies. Excellent for back of the garden border.



Common Boneset

Eupatorium perfoliatum \$12.00

The loose clusters of white flowers topping this compact plant (3-4' tall) serve as a pollinator magnet, especially butterflies. Naturally found in wetlands, it will need plenty of moisture. Blooms late summer.



Blue Fescue

Festuca glauca 'Beyond Blue' \$12.00

Blue green foliage makes this a great accent plant year round. Excellent for massing as well. It remains compact at 10-12" tall and 15" wide.





Blanket Flower

Gaillardia aristata 'Arizona Sun' \$ 12.00

Masses of orange-red blooms cover this native cultivar each summer. Once established, little care and watering is needed, and it can be quite drought tolerant. Deer resistant and it attracts pollinators. Low mounding habit, growing to about 10" tall and wide.



Sneezeweed

Helenium autumnale \$12.00

This is a tall perennial (3-5' tall) features bright yellow daisy-like flowers. It does well in moist/wet locations but can tolerate drier locations once established. A perfect plant for rain gardens. It is a favorite for pollinators.



Hibiscus

Hibiscus 'Vintage Wine' \$ 12.00

This plant features large, 7" wide scarlet flowers. While it projects a tropical vibe, this is a cultivar of a plant that is native from Canada to Florida and is hardy in the Winchester area. The plant gets big (4' tall and 5' wide) so make sure to give it some room in your garden.



Pseudata Iris

Iris pseudata 'Yarai' \$ 12.00

This is a cross between a flag iris and a Japanese water iris. Great for wet areas but also thrives in drier sites. Can grow 3-4' tall. Yarai features peach petals with purple veins.



Siberian Iris

Iris 'Cape Cod Boys' \$ 12.00

One of the more versatile irises for the garden. Siberian irises can take moderately dry locations or do well in moister spots. They also are more shade tolerant than other irises. This cultivar features periwinkle blue flowers.





Roof Iris

Iris tectorum \$12.00

A white form of crested, beardless iris. Large 6" blooms stand over 15" tall sword like leaves. Can tolerate wet conditions but are at home in rock gardens as well. Will naturalize and spread. Deer resistant.



Red Hot Poker

Kniphofia 'Red Roulette' \$12.00

A great plant for sunny spots without much water. Tall spikes of orange and yellow tubes draw all sorts of pollinators and hummingbirds, yet the deer don't like this plant. Flowers can reach 40" tall.



Shasta Daisy

Leucanthemum superbum 'Becky' \$ 12.00

A sturdy cultivar, this daisy produces loads of white flowers each summer. It stands tall at 36" but does not require staking to keep it up. Removing spent blooms helps keep the flowers going during the summer.



Blazing Star

Liatris spicata \$ 12.00

This prairie native is one of the best plants for attracting pollinators. When the spikes are blooming in early to midsummer, expect to find them covered in butterflies. The purple spikes will stand 18-20" tall. Deer resistant.



Maltese Cross

Lychnis arkwrightii 'Orange Gnome' \$ 12.00

It's hard to miss this colorful plant in the garden, with brilliant orange flowers on purplish-green leaves. It blooms in early summer and the flowers can last for weeks. It tolerates a variety of soils as long as it gets plenty of sun.





Muhly Grass

Muhlenbergia reverchonii 'Undaunted' \$12.00

One of the most ornamental native grasses, it forms a nice 30" tall clump of wiry grass for much of the summer but explodes with pink airy flowers in late summer, early fall.

Takes full sun and drought conditions. This cultivar is more cold hardy.



Catmint

Nepeta x faassenii 'Purrsian Blue' \$ 12.00

Aromatic leaves and soft blue flowers make this a great plant to place along the edge of a path. Blooms through the summer and attracts all sorts of pollinators. Grows to about 24" tall. Does not need much water and is deer resistant.



Beardtongue

Penstemon 'Prairie Dusk' \$ 12.00

Beardtongue is a solid performer in the garden with dramatic spikes of colorful flowers. This cultivar features rose-purple flowers. It is not bothered by heat and humidity and is quite drought tolerant.



Russian Sage

Perovskia atriplicfolia \$12.00

This perennial loves hot dry locations and is a rugged plant for the garden. It features airy spikes of flowers on silvery foliage and makes an effective filler in the garden. Grows 3-4' tall and 20-30" wide.



Woodland Phlox

Phlox divaricata 'Blue Moon' \$ 12.00

This spring flowering phlox has bright fragrant lavender flowers in April/May. Staying compact, it will only grow 12-18" tall with glossy foliage staying about 6" tall. Foliage sprawls and plays well with other plants. Attracts butterflies and even hummingbirds.





Garden Phlox

Phlox paniculata 'Jeana' \$12.00

This cultivar is very mildew resistant and is covered in lavender-pink flowers in the summer. A pollinator magnet. It is a tall plant, growing 4-5' tall.



Creeping Phlox

Phlox stolonifera 'Sherwood Purple' \$ 12.00

A mat-forming creeping phlox with bright starlike flowers. An excellent ground cover staying about 6" tall and provides bright purple flowers for early season pollinators.

Phlox subulata \$12.00

A long-flowering white creeping phlox, this is a great plant for steep slopes, retaining walls and rock gardens. It will spread out to form a small carpet only 6" tall. Drought tolerant.



Obedient Plant

Physostegia virginiana 'Miss Manners' \$12.00

This clumping cultivar does not spread aggressively. It features 18-24" tall spikes of white flowers in summer. Can tolerate wet conditions.



Salvia

Salvia 'Ballerina Pink' PP29957 \$ 12.00

A pink flowering form of the hardy garden salvia, this plant produces 18" tall spikes of soft pink flowers. Pollinator friendly and deer resistant.

Salvia nemerosa 'May Night' \$ 12.00

A top landscape performer with dense spikes of violetpurple flowers. Blooms reach 18" tall in early summer. Pollinator friendly and deer resistant.



Hens N Chicks

Sempervivum 'Silverine' \$12.00

This succulent forms rosettes of silvery leaves with a reddish-purple base. The perfect plant for crevices, stone walls or walkways. Thrives in poor soil as long as it is well drained.



Ironweed

Vernonia noveboracensis \$ 12.00

This rugged perennial can get tall at 4' feet or more. Purple blooms in late summer are perfect for butterflies and bees yet the deer don't like it. It will take up some space in your garden but it is worth giving it the room.



Speedwell

Veronica 'Very Van Gogh' \$12.00

Popular with honeybees, butterflies, and hummingbirds, this plant features purple spikes of flowers. Growing about 20" tall and wide it is a long blooming mid-late summer flower.



Yucca

Yucca filimentosa 'Excalibur' \$ 12.00

The spikes of gray-green leaves form a uniform clump of spikiness. Curly white filaments trail from the leaf edge. In mid-summer a spike of creamy white flowers rises above the foliage for a dramatic show. This drought tolerant cultivar is smaller than the species, growing about 2' tall and 3' wide.





Perennials for Sunny and/or Shady Spots

These perennials like full sun but also will grow well with only 4 hours of direct sun. Some grow well in more shade.

All plants in this section are in 1-gallon pots unless noted otherwise.

Azure Monkshood

Aconitum fischeri \$12.00

This plant sends up 24" spikes of hooded blue flowers in the fall. Also known as wolfsbane as it is poisonous. Not recommended for gardens with little children or plant eating pets, but good for witches and werewolf hunters.



Bugleweed

Ajuga reptans 'Burgandy Glow' \$ 12.00

A spreading groundcover with tri-colored leaves. In late spring, spikes of blue flowers bloom but the foliage is the real feature through the summer and fall. It does well in full sun, but it does equally well in the shade of a tree.



Allium

Allium 'Bubble Bath' \$ 12.00

This deer-resistant plant features clusters of 3" round light-purple flowers each spring. An ornamental onion, the flowers are smaller than the large bulb-like alliums and the slightly twisted leaves stay attractive through the fall.



Allium

Allium christophii \$12.00

This fall planted bulb produces a large 10" globe of spiky violet-pink florets. It is a late spring bloomer, and the flowers will dry nicely. Deer resistant.





Arkansas Blue Star

Amsonia hubrichtii \$ 12.00

This southern native is attractive in 3 seasons. Blue starshaped flowers bloom in spring and the soft, finely textured leaves just beg to be touched. In fall, the leaves turn a brilliant golden color for an added touch to the autumn garden. Deer resistant



Columbine

Aquilegia caerulea 'Kirigami' \$ 12.00

These large flowering hybrids of an old-fashioned plant provide bright colors in the late spring garden. They do well in a little bit of shade and enjoy the spring sun. They do well as cut flowers.



Wild Columbine

Aquilegia canadensis \$ 12.00

This native plant features red nodding flowers in late April and early May. A short-lived perennial, it will selfseed easily. Naturalizes in wooded/shady conditions. Deer resistant



Columbine

Aquilegia canadensis 'Little Langerns' \$12.00

This shorter version (12" tall) of the classic red columbine is great in a more constrained planting area. Red flowers bloom slightly earlier than the species.



Japanese Spikenard

Aralia c. 'Sun King' \$12.00

The large golden compound leaves measure 3 feet long.
This part shade plant wants at least a few hours of sun a day to retain the chartreuse color in its leaves. This deer resistant plant features racines of small white flowers in late summer.





Goat's Beard

Aruncus diocius \$ 12.00

A large specimen plant for a partially shaded garden, it features creamy white flowers up to 1 foot long. It can be slow to establish, but after a couple of seasons, this plant puts on a show each year. It can grow 4-5' tall so make



sure to give this bee-friendly, deer-resistant plant room in the garden.

Astilbe

Astilbe 'Bressingham Beauty' \$ 12.00

This is the classic pink astilbe. Lacy panicles of beefriendly flowers bloom in early summer and get as tall as 36". Can thrive in full sun or full shade so very adaptable to many growing conditions. Deer resistant.



Plumbago

Ceratostigma plumbaginoides \$12.00

A great groundcover for late summer. The green foliage turns a brilliant red in the fall and both versions are a nice background for the bright blue flowers. A low spreading plant that is great under shrubs and on rock breaks.



Foxglove

Digitalis purpurea 'Dalmation Purple' \$12.00

A classic in any garden. Pink bell-shaped flowers with speckled throats. This 3' tall plant is the natural source for the medicine digitalin. Will take plenty of sun as well.



Globe Thistle

Echinops 'Blue Glow' \$12.00

This well-behaved clumping perennial is topped with intense blue spheres during the summer. It is popular with many pollinators. Grows 30" tall. Makes a good cut flower for arrangements.





Hardy Geranium

Geranium maculatum 'Rozanne' \$ 12.00

This hardy geranium hybrid does well in heat and humidity. Blue flowers hover about the sprawling plant, which makes a good ground cover. Does well in full sun and prefers some afternoon shade.



Leopard Plant

Ligularia 'Britt-Marie Crawford' \$ 12.00

Dark, bold leaves make a statement in a mixed planting of flowers. In late summer, golden daisy-like flowers perch over the flowers making a 3' tall showy display. Prefers partial shade. Deer resistant.



Cardinal Flower

Lobelia cardinalis \$ 12.00

The late-summer spikes of red flowers of this native are a magnet for butterflies, bees, and hummingbirds. It does well in moist or boggy areas or just average soil. Best in partial shade but tolerates full sun. Deer resistant.



Great Blue Lobelia

Lobelia siphilitica \$ 12.00

A wetland native with spikes of blue flowers that attract pollinators in late summer. Naturalizes well in moist sites but can tolerate drought and performs well in a garden flower bed. Plants will self-sow in the right conditions. Deer resistant.



Lance-leaved Loosestrife

Lysimachia lanceolata 'Burgandy Mist' \$12.00

This is a tough groundcover that is excellent for keeping weeds at bay. Small yellow flowers stand out against dark spiky foliage. Drought tolerant. 1-2' tall and wide.



Bee Balm

Monarda didyma 'Jacob Cline' \$ 12.00

This native cultivar was selected for its superior resistance to mildew. Large red flowers are a magnet for pollinators and hummingbirds. Blooms from June to August and will get 3-4 feet tall when in flower. Likes full sun and moist conditions but is adaptable and will spread readily.



Wild Bergamot

Monarda fistulosa \$12.00

An easy to grow native plant that spreads easily. Aromatic foliage supports lavender flowers that attract butterflies and hummingbirds. Perfect in our meadows and for your garden. 30-48" tall.



Golden Groundsel

Packera aurea \$ 12.00

An excellent groundcover for partly shaded areas. Shiny leaves grow low to the ground and in the spring 12" spikes of yellow flowers herald the warm weather. Self-seeds and naturalizes well.



Peony

Paeonia 'Festiva Maxima' \$20.00

This classic garden plant is a standard in our garden. Deer resistant, it blooms in late spring. Festiva Maxima has been around for decades and is popular for its white flowers with a carmine eye. Slightly fragrant. It does well in full sun but thrives with some light shade.



Peony

Paeonia 'Kansas' \$20.00

This peony features double watermelon-red flowers. Will grow to about 36" tall and does well with a bit of staking to support the heavy flowers.





Short-thoothed Mountain Mint

Pycanthemum muticum \$12.00

This native mint attracts so many pollinators it practically buzzes all summer long. Silvery bracts surrounding small pink flowers top aromatic foliage. A very competitive



workhorse for extreme sites and slopes, it will spread slowly so give it some room to grow. Deer and rabbit resistant it is also the host plant for the Gray Streak Butterfly

Black-eyed Susan

Rudbeckia fulgida 'Goldsturm' \$ 12.00

This native black-eyed Susan is a proven performer in the garden. Strong, long lasting golden flowers provide color all summer long. A great plant for pollinators. If you let the flowers go to seed, it will also attract many birds. Goldfinches cover ours each year. While it will tolerate some shade, it flowers best in full sun.



Sweet Coneflower

Rudbeckia subtomentosa 'Henry Eilers' \$12.00

This variety features finely quilled yellow petals that are stunning. The leaves remain low and the stems can grow over 4' tall. The late summer flowers are excellent for pollinators and birds.



Woodland Pinkroot

Spigelia marilandica 'Little Redhead' \$12.00

This summer flowering native is a clump forming perennial that does well in natural areas or a formal garden. Red flowers topped by yellow stars appear in summer. Best in partial or full shade.





Betony

Stachys monieri 'Hummelo' \$12.00

Spikes of lavender-purple flowers grow tall on leafless stems. Basal rosettes of dark green leaves form slowly spreading clumps. Deer resistant.



Golden Alexanders

Zizia aurea \$12.00

This May-June blooming plant is a native that helps bridge the period of bloom between early spring and summer. 30" tall clusters of tiny yellow flowers top dark green foliage. Likes moist soils but can tolerate drought once established. Ideal for pollinators such as bees.





Perennials for shady spots

These perennials like shade. Need less than 6 hours of direct sun a day. All plants in this section are in 1-gallon pots unless noted otherwise.

Anemone

Anemone 'Honorine Jobert' \$ 12.00

The tall single white flowers of these fall-blooming plants are a perfect addition to a cottage garden where a little shade is present. A nice stop for butterflies in the fall garden. It is deer resistant.



Siberian Bugloss

Brunnera macrophylla 'Jack Frost' \$ 12.00

We get lots of comments and questions about this plant growing in the Water Garden and Jasmine allee. This cultivar features frosted green leaves and beautiful blue flowers in the spring. Grows 10" high and spreads out about 20"



Turtlehead

Chelone glabra \$ 12.00

White, turtlehead-shaped blooms cluster atop dark foliage on this stunning plant. This native plant blooms midsummer and is deer resistant. It grows 2-4' tall and prefers moist soils, performing exceptionally well on moist stream banks or in marshy areas.



Green and Gold

Chrysogonium virginiana 'Allen Bush' \$12.00

This woodland native groundcover is excellent in filtered shade. Staying low at 8" it can form a nice mat of foliage topped with bright yellow flowers. Good on a path edge.





Lenten Rose

Helleborus 'Rome in Red' \$ 12.00

Blooming in late winter/early spring, Lenten roses are a welcome sign that spring is on its way. Numerous blossoms of single flowers on each plant provide a variety of colors. Good for naturalizing in shady areas, it will grow 18" tall and gradually spread. Deer resistant.



Coral Bells

Heuchera 'Caramel' \$ 12.00

This cultivar features apricot to amber foliage. Drought tolerant and an excellent plant for the shade. Will get about 18" tall when in bloom. Will spread slowly as a clump and can be divided every few years.



Coral Bells

Heuchera 'Smoke and Mirrors' \$12.00

This cultivar features gray foliage that pops in the shade. Does well in the heat and humidity of summer. Will spread slowly as a clump and can be divided every few years.



Dwarf Crested Iris

Iris cristata \$12.00

A native shade-loving iris that blooms in early spring. This diminutive plant only reaches 6-8" tall with sword-like leaves and blue-violet blooms. Spreads to form small colonies on the woodland floor.



Virginia Bluebell

Mertensia virginica \$ 12.00

This native flower is a hallmark of spring in Virginia. A great woodland plant, this is a spring ephemeral as the flower and leaves will die back and disappear in the summer.





Sensitive Fern

Onoclea sensibilis \$12.00

A low maintenance, low growing plant that spreads to make an excellent ground cover in moist shade. Grows to 2' tall, it is deciduous. Best in woodland or shady rain garden settings.



Creeping Jacobs Ladder

Polemonium reptans \$12.00

An easy growing groundcover that does well moist shade and streambanks. The foliage grows about 12" tall and light blue flowers hover above. May go dormant in periods of drought.



Foamflower

Tiarella cordifolia \$ 12.00

This native woodland plant makes a great groundcover, spreading slowly by stolons. 10" tall white spiky flowers bloom in late spring. Likes plenty of organic matter and consistent moisture.





Vines

Woodbine

Clematis virginiana \$ 12.00

This native is a good alternative for the invasive sweet autumn clematis. This vigorous vine features coarsely toothed leaves and scented white flowers in the late summer and fall. Can grow 12-20' tall.



Coral Honeysuckle

Lonicera sempervirens 'Major Wheeler' \$12.00

This is profuse red-flowering cultivar of the native honeysuckle. A twining vine, it will grow nicely on a fence or trellis and the red flowers attract hummingbirds. Blooms more profusely in full sun but tolerates shade. Grows to about 10' tall.





Shrubs for sunny spots

Shrubs that do well with more than 6 hours of direct sun a day. Most shrubs are in 3-gallon pots.

Abelia

Abelia x grandiflora 'Little Richard' \$30.00

A compact shrub with glossy green leaves. In the summer fragrant white flowers bloom that provide excellent nectar for bees. Will grow 4' tall and wide. Deer resistant.



Red Chokeberry

Aronia arbutifolia 'Brilliantissima' \$ 30.00

This 8' tall native shrub has white spring flowers and brilliant red fall berries popular with birds. Great for naturalized plantings. Best in full sun but can tolerate some shade. We grow them near the Jasmine Allée.



Carolina Allspice

Calycanthus floridus \$ 30.00

This native shrub will grow 5' high and wide and features fragrant reddish-brown flowers that bloom in spring. Deer resistant. A specimen is growing near the tool shed at the MSV.



Summersweet

Clethra alnifolia 'September Beauty' \$ 30.00

Spikes of fragrant, white flowers cover this plant in midsummer. Blooms best in full sun, but naturally grows under larger trees. Does well in moist soils. Shrubs grow about 3-6' tall and 3-4' wide.





Red twig dogwood

Cornus sericea 'Baileyi' \$ 30.00

This native shrub naturally grows in low wet areas along lakes and rivers. While it has small white flowers in late spring the red twigs in winter make a spectacular show. It grows about 6' tall and wide and is good for wildlife.



Witch Alder

Fothergilla major 'Mt. Airy' \$ 30.00

This native shrub with fragrant white bottlebrush flowers in spring has bright yellow-orange leaves in the fall. Best in a shrub border or foundation planting. Upright growth habit and gets to 6' tall and 4'. Look for them growing in the shrub border behind the Jasmine allee at the MSV.



Inkberry

Ilex glabra 'Nigra' \$30.00

An evergreen native holly that remains small (4' tall and wide'). Dark green leaves with black berry-like fruit. Prefers moist soil. Does best in sun but can handle shade.



Winterberry - female

Ilex verticillata 'Winter Red' \$ 30.00

This native holly features dark green leaves that drop in the winter to reveal bright red berries that will persist through the winter. Can grow 9' tall and 8' wide. Produces more berries in full sun. Will need a male winterberry (see below) to pollinate the female flowers.



Winterberry - male

Ilex verticillata 'Southern Gentleman' \$ 30.00

This male form of winterberry blooms when the female 'Winter Red' flowers and is one of the better pollinators to ensure good berry set in the female. One male will provide enough pollen for 3-4 female shrubs. Not quite as large as the female, it will grow 8' tall and wide. Does not produce berries.



Virginia sweetspire

Itea virginica 'Henry's Garnet' \$ 25.00

A cultivar of a native shrub found naturally growing in wet locations. However, has good drought tolerance. Can handle full sun or shade. Spreads gradually and has long fragrant white flowers in late spring/early summer. Great fall foliage. Will get to 4' tall and 5' wide. We have large groupings in Kathie's Spring Garden at the MSV.



Grey Owl Juniper

Juniperus virginiana 'Grey Owl' \$25.00

This cultivar of the native eastern red cedar is relatively low spreading plant (3' tall and 6' wide). Gray foliage is unusual for a red cedar. Drought tolerant when established.



Ninebark

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Summer Wine' \$ 35.00

A rounded shrub that does well in poor soils. It will get 8' tall and wide. The purple foliage is striking, and it will produce pink flowers in late spring. Drought tolerant. We have used it for a hedge in our parking lot, but it makes a great specimen plant as well.



Lilac

Syringa 'Bloomerang Dark Purple' \$35.00

This hybrid was one of the first to be developed to rebloom later in the summer after an initial spring flowering. A classic lilac purple flower will bloom on a shrub that will get 5' tall and wide.





Shrubs for shady spots

Shrubs that are happy with less than six hours of direct sunlight Most shrubs are in 3-gallon pots

Smooth Hydrangea

Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle' \$30.00

An improved cultivar of the native smooth hydrangea, this shrub features massive snowball white flowers. Prefers light shade but grows well in sun. Will get 5' tall and wide.



Hydrangea

Hydrangea macrophylla 'Nikko Blue' \$25.00

This classic garden hydrangea features large globe-like blue flowers in mid-summer. Can grow 6' tall and wide and deer resistant.



Oakleaf hydrangea

Hydrangea quercifolia 'Alice' \$ 30.00

This native cultivar produces large white cone-shaped flowers. The oak-shaped leaves turn a bright burgundy in the fall for added interest. It will get 5' wide and tall. One is growing in the shade of the Pink Pavilion.



Doublefile Viburnum

Viburnum plicatum var. tomentosum 'Shasta' \$ 30.00

A broad spreading shrub that will get 6-7' tall but as wide as 10'. Large white lace-cap flowers top horizontal branches in the spring. Great fall color. Excellent for hedges or specimen plants. Does well in part shade but also in full sun.





Trees

Serviceberry

Amelanchier x grandiflora 'Autumn Brilliance' \$110.00

A hybrid between downy serviceberry and Allegheny serviceberry, this is a small multi-trunked understory tree. Showy white flowers in the spring, edible fruit and bright color in the fall make this a great tree for multiple seasons. 2 trees are available, 5-6' tall, rootballs covered in burlap.



Redbud

Cercis canadensis \$150.00

This native small tree grows 20-30' tall and 25-35' wide. Easily grown in most soils that are not exceedingly wet. Stunning rose-purple flowers in the spring before foliage emerges. 2 plants are available, 6-8' tall and are in 15-gallon containers.



Fringetree

Chionanthus virginicus \$95.00

A native small tree that grows 12-20' tall and wide. Also known as grancy graybeard. Very adaptable to soil types and grows best in full sun. White flowers in spring look like shredded petals and nice yellow leaves in the fall. Four plants are available in 7-gallon containers.



Dogwood

Cornus florida f. 'Cherokee Princess' \$95.00

A vigorous disease resistant selection of the native understory tree. The classic white dogwood with good fall color, it is perfect for the home garden. Can grow 30' tall and 25' wide. 2 plants are available in 7-gallon containers.





Sweet Bay

Magnolia virginiana \$ 95.00

A small to medium tree that will grow 20-35' tall and wide. Native to Virginia's coastal plain and piedmont. Extremely fragrant white flowers in early summer. Great specimen tree for the garden or can tolerate wet soils. Semi-evergreen in the Winchester area. 3 plants are available in 7-gallon containers.



Heritage Oak

Quercus x macdanielli \$195.00

A cross between the English oak and our native bur oak, this is a large shade tree with a pyramidal habit. Vigorous growth for an oak, it will eventually reach 60' tall and spread 45' wide. Needs lots of room. Great for wildlife. 2 plants are available, 1.5" caliper trunk, 10-11' tall, with large rootball wrapped in burlap. Will need a truck to take home.

Annuals, Herbs, Vegetables

The MSV will have a limited selection of summer annuals, herbs and vegetables available at the sale. Exact plants to be determined based on availability from the greenhouse as the gardens are planted for the summer.
