# **Perennials for Sunny Spots**

Perennial plants that want more than 6 hours of sun a day All plants in this section are in 1-gallon pots unless noted otherwise.

#### **Yarrow**

Achillea 'Moonshine' \$12.00

For sunny, hot, dry sites, yarrow is a proven performer. Popular with butterflies and bees but not with deer, this yellow hybrid introduced in the 1950s features silvery foliage and gets almost 3' tall. Great as a cut or dried flower.



#### **Yarrow**

Achillea 'Terracotta' \$12.00

For sunny, hot, dry sites, yarrow is a proven performer. Popular with butterflies and bees but not with deer, the flowers of this hybrid emerge a bright peach color and turn to a clay pot color. Gets almost 3' tall.



# **Anise Hyssop**

*Agastache* 'Blue Fortune' \$12.00

These 30" tall spires of blue flowers are popular with butterflies and bees. This drought tolerant plant has fragrant foliage and blooms from mid-summer into the fall.





#### Wormwood

Artemesia 'Silver Mound' \$ 12.00

A low mounding, silvery foliage plant that looks great on the edge of a garden path. Does not need a lot of watering and is deer resistant.



# **Swamp Milkweed**

Ascelpias incarnata \$ 12.00

This native wetland perennial does well in moist soils and rain gardens. It is a host plant for Monarch butterfly caterpillars but attracts many other pollinators as well. It features a cluster of upturned deep pink flowers that bloom mid-summer.



## **Butterfly Weed**

Asclepias tuberosa \$ 12.00

Bright orange flowers attract all sorts of butterflies and of course it is a host plant for Monarch butterflies. The plant itself grows about 24" tall and is a rugged performer in the summer garden. May be late coming out in the spring.



#### Aster

Aster novae-angliae 'Purple Dome' \$ 12.00

This tried-and-true aster is a great flower to have in the fall. This native cultivar is compact, growing only to 18" or so. Attracts butterflies and bees late into the season.



#### **Aromatic Aster**

Aster oblongifolius 'Raydon's Favorite' \$12.00

Medium blue flowers bloom in early fall. Aromatic foliage that grows to 3' tall. It does well in dry sunny spots and is deer resistant.





#### **Tatarian Aster**

Aster tataricus 'Jindai' \$12.00

This late season bloomer is great for pollinators in the fall. Clusters of small blue daisy-like flowers top a 4 to 5' tall stem, so this works well in the back of any flower bed.



# **False Indigo**

Baptisia 'American Goldfinch' \$14.00

A big plant with bright color that will make a statement in any garden. This is a heavily flowering yellow cultivar of our native false indigo.



## **False Indigo**

Baptisia australis 'Grape Escape' \$ 14.00

Blue spikes bloom in May and are a great transition bloomer in mid to late spring. Growing 3-4' tall, this is a good plant for the middle or back of the flower bed and the leaves make a great back background for other plants.



#### **Tickseed**

Coreopsis UPTICK™ 'Gold & Bronze' \$12.00

Golden yellow flowers with bronze-red centers top this easy growing upright plant. An easy to grow plant that gets about 14" tall and needs little attention. Good for cut flowers.



#### **Tickseed**

Coreopsis 'Red Satin' \$ 12.00

A red selection of the threadleaf coreopsis that makes a great accent. A little more compact than the straight species, it will grow to about 18" tall and wide.





# **Threadleaf Coreopsis**

Coreopsis verticillata 'Moonbeam' \$ 12.00

Bright yellow flowers sprawl across the tops of soft, fine foliage and make a stunning show midsummer. This native grows to about 24" tall and is drought tolerant. Popular with all sorts of pollinators.



#### **Montbretia**

Crocosmia 'Lucifer' \$12.00

Tall sword-like leaves make this plant a spiky vertical element in garden design and the red blooms on wiry stems just add to that. It will get 36" tall, but only about 12" wide. The red tubular flowers are attractive hummingbirds. It loves full sun but can tolerate some light shade.



#### **Ice Plant**

Delosperma Fire Spinner ® \$12.00

Bright blooms cover this ground cover that spreads 18-24" wide. Heat and drought tolerant with its succulent foliage. It does best in well drained soils, making it an excellent plant for containers, rock gardens and slopes.



#### **Pinks**

Dianthus 'Red Rouge' \$12.00

This colorful but low growing plant is perfect for the front of a flower bed or along the edge of a walk. Red flowers with pink edges and flecking make this a charmer.



### **Yellow Coneflower**

Echinacea paradoxa \$12.00

A yellow purple coneflower is certainly the paradox. Bright drooping petals surround a brown cone that is popular with goldfinches. It will grow 2-3' tall it does well in limestone soils – perfect for the Shenandoah Valley.





# **Purple Coneflower**

Echinacea purpurea \$ 12.00

A North American native great for attracting insects and birds to your garden. Growing 36" tall, it is topped with large purple daisy-like flowers in late summer. Adaptable to most situations as long as it gets plenty of sun.



# **Purple Coneflower**

Echinacea purpurea 'Ruby Star' \$12.00

This cultivar is shorter than the species with large flowers that are a deep purple pink, almost red.



#### **Rattlesnake Master**

Eryngium yuccifolium \$12.00

A 5' tall stem topped with thistle-like bluish silver flowers grows out of a small cluster of spiny leaves resembling yucca. Once common to eastern prairies, this plant likes sunny, well drained locations and makes an architectural statement in any garden.



# Joe-Pye Weed

Eupatorium dubium 'Little Joe' \$ 12.00

This compact cultivar of the native perennial (3-4' tall) features clusters of pink purplish flowers in late summer. It likes moist places and attracts a variety of pollinators including many butterflies. Excellent for back of the garden border.



# Joe-Pye Weed

Eupatorium 'Phantom' \$12.00

A dwarf variety that is perfect in flower borders or containers. Clusters of purple flowers attract pollinators mid-summer through fall. Grows to only 2-4' tall.



#### **Blue Fescue**

Festuca glauca 'Beyond Blue' \$12.00

Blue green foliage makes this a great accent plant year round. Excellent for massing as well. It remains compact at 10-12" tall and 15" wide.



### **Blanket Flower**

Gaillardia aristata 'Arizona Sun' \$ 12.00

Masses of orange-red blooms cover this native cultivar each summer. Once established, little care and watering is needed, and it can be quite drought tolerant. Deer resistant and it attracts pollinators. Low mounding habit, growing to about 10" tall and wide.



### **Sneezeweed**

Helenium autumnale \$12.00

This is a tall perennial (3-5' tall) features bright yellow daisy-like flowers. It does well in moist/wet locations but can tolerate drier locations once established. A perfect plant for rain gardens. It is a favorite for pollinators.



#### **Hibiscus**

Hibiscus 'Angel Eyes' \$ 12.00

This plant features large, 8" wide white flowers with a raspberry red eye. While it projects a tropical vibe, this is a cultivar of a plant that is native from Canada to Florida and is hardy in the Winchester area. The plant gets big (5' tall and 5' wide) so make sure to give it some room in your garden.



#### **Hibiscus**

*Hibiscus* 'Summer in Paradise' \$12.00

This plant features large, 7" wide red flowers. The medium green maple-like leaves are accented by olive green edges. Hardy in the Winchester area. The plant gets wide (3' tall and 4' wide) so make sure to give it some room in your garden.





#### Siberian Iris

Iris 'Cape Cod Boys' \$ 12.00

One of the more versatile irises for the garden. Siberian irises can take moderately dry locations or do well in moister spots. They also are more shade tolerant than other irises. This cultivar features periwinkle blue flowers.



#### Pseudata Iris

*Iris pseudata* 'Yarai' \$ 12.00

This is a cross between a flag iris and a Japanese water iris. Great for wet areas but also thrives in drier sites. Can grow 3-4' tall. Yarai features peach petals with purple veins.



## Japanese Aster

*Kalimeris incisa* 'Blue Star' \$12.00

This mounding plant (18" tall and 24" wide) features masses of small lavender daisy flowers from June until autumn. Loves heat and humidity and tolerates drought. Similar to other Asters and Boltonia.



## **Red Hot Poker**

*Kniphofia* 'Red Roulette' \$12.00

A great plant for sunny spots without much water. Tall spikes of orange and yellow tubes draw all sorts of pollinators and hummingbirds, yet the deer don't like this plant. Flowers can reach 40" tall.



# **Shasta Daisy**

Leucanthemum superbum 'Becky' \$ 12.00

A sturdy cultivar, this daisy produces loads of white flowers each summer. It stands tall at 36" but does not require staking to keep it up. Removing spent blooms helps keep the flowers going during the summer.





# **Blazing Star**

Liatris spicata \$ 12.00

This prairie native is one of the best plants for attracting pollinators. When the spikes are blooming in early to midsummer, expect to find them covered in butterflies. The purple spikes will stand 3-5" tall. Deer resistant.



# **Dwarf Blazing Star**

Liatris spicata 'Kobold' \$12.00

This is a smaller, compact form of the regular species. The purple spikes will stand 18-20" tall.



#### **Maltese Cross**

Lychnis arkwrightii 'Orange Gnome' \$ 12.00

It's hard to miss this colorful plant in the garden, with brilliant orange flowers on purplish-green leaves. It blooms in early summer and the flowers can last for weeks. It tolerates a variety of soils as long as it gets plenty of sun.



# **Muhly Grass**

Muhlenbergia capillaris' \$12.00

One of the most ornamental native grasses, it forms a nice 30" tall clump of wiry grass for much of the summer but explodes with pink airy flowers in late summer, early fall.

Takes full sun and drought conditions. This cultivar is more cold hardy.



### **Catmint**

Nepeta x faassenii 'Walker's Low' \$ 12.00

Aromatic leaves and soft blue flowers make this a great plant to place along the edge of a path. Blooms through the summer and attracts all sorts of pollinators. Grows to about 24" tall. Does not need much water and is deer resistant.





# **Beardtongue**

Penstemon 'Onyx and Pearls' \$ 12.00

Beardtongue is a solid performer in the garden with dramatic spikes of colorful flowers. This cultivar features lavender flowers with white interiors blooming above dark foliage. It is not bothered by heat and humidity and is quite drought tolerant.



## **Russian Sage**

Perovskia atriplicfolia 'Blue Jean Baby' \$12.00

This perennial loves hot dry locations and is a rugged plant for the garden. It features airy spikes of flowers on silvery foliage and makes an effective filler in the garden. Smaller than other Russian Sages, this cultivar grows 2-3' tall and 30" wide.



### **Woodland Phlox**

Phlox divaricata 'Blue Moon' \$ 12.00

This spring flowering phlox has bright fragrant lavender flowers in April/May. Staying compact, it will only grow 12-18" tall with glossy foliage staying about 6" tall. Foliage sprawls and plays well with other plants. Attracts butterflies and even hummingbirds.



## **Garden Phlox**

Phlox paniculata 'Jeana' \$12.00

This cultivar is very mildew resistant and is covered in lavender-pink flowers in the summer. A pollinator magnet. It is a tall plant, growing 4-5' tall.



### **Garden Phlox**

*Phlox paniculata* 'Party Girl' \$12.00

Another mildew resistant phlox, this plant features white flowers with star-shaped light pink centers. Great for pollinators. Grows to 32" inches tall and wide.





# **Creeping Phlox**

Phlox stolonifera 'Sherwood Purple' \$ 12.00

A mat-forming creeping phlox with bright starlike flowers. An excellent ground cover staying about 6" tall and provides bright purple flowers for early season pollinators.



# **Creeping Phlox**

Phlox subulata \$12.00

A long-flowering blue creeping phlox, this is a great plant for steep slopes, retaining walls and rock gardens. It will spread out to form a small carpet only 6" tall. Drought tolerant.



### **Obedient Plant**

Physostegia virginiana 'Pink Manners' \$12.00

This clumping cultivar does not spread aggressively. It features 18-24" tall spikes of pink flowers in summer. Can tolerate wet conditions.



### **Prairie Coneflower**

Ratibida columnifera 'Red Midget' \$12.00

A seed selection of a prairie native, this plant does best in well drained soils and is drought resistant. Excellent for naturalizing, it will get 18-36" tall and wide. Deer resistant.



### Wild Petunia

Ruellia humilis \$12.00

A drought-tolerant prairie native with lavender-blue flowers. Will grow 24-36" tall and does well in pots or a garden setting. Can seed vigorously so may spread around in the garden flower bed. Deer resistant.





#### Salvia

Salvia 'Ballerina Pink' PP29957 \$ 12.00

A pink flowering form of the hardy garden salvia, this plant produces 18" tall spikes of soft pink flowers. Pollinator friendly and deer resistant.



*Salvia* 'Bumbleberry' PP31602 \$12.00

This vibrant pink and purple flowering salvia will make a statement in the garden. Compact at 12" tall. Pollinator friendly and deer resistant.



Salvia nemerosa 'May Night' \$ 12.00

A top landscape performer with dense spikes of violetpurple flowers. Blooms reach 18" tall in early summer. Pollinator friendly and deer resistant.

### **Pincushion Flower**

Scabiosa colmbaria 'Butterfly Blue' \$12.00

This lavender blue flower sits atop wiry stems hovering over a rosette of leaves. Excellent cut flowers and popular with pollinators. Grows 12-18" tall and spreads about 15" wide. Does well in alkaline soil.

# Stonecrop

Sedum 'Cherry Tart' PP24603 \$12.00

Stunning cherry-red leaves of this creeping succulent look fantastic in a rock garden, flower bed or as a general groundcover. Brilliant pink flowers bloom in late summer. Prefers well-drained soils and intolerant of wet soils.













## **Stonecrop**

Sedum 'Night Light' PPAF \$12.00

This upright stonecrop features dark green leaves on purple stems that provide an excellent backdrop for the light yellow blooms in the fall. Grows 22-26" tall.



#### Goldenrod

Solidago rugosa 'Fireworks' \$ 12.00

A native clump forming plant with radiating flower form covered in yellow blooms in late summer. It is a pollinator magnet attracting bees, butterflies and beetles. It performs well dry soils but can tolerate wetter situations if needed, making it an excellent for a rain garden. Will gradually spread by creeping rhizomes.



#### **Ironweed**

Vernonia noveboracensis \$ 12.00

This rugged perennial can get tall at 4' feet or more. Purple blooms in late summer are perfect for butterflies and bees yet the deer don't like it. It will take up some space in your garden but it is worth giving it the room.



# **Speedwell**

Veronica 'Perfectly Picasso' \$12.00

Popular with honeybees, butterflies, and hummingbirds, this plant features spikes of flowers that show white buds before opening to a pink flower. Growing about 24" tall and wide it is a long blooming mid-late summer flower.

# Perennials for Sunny and/or Shady Spots

These perennials like full sun but also will grow well with only 4 hours of direct sun. Some grow well in more shade.

All plants in this section are in 1-gallon pots unless noted otherwise.

# **Grassy-leaved Sweet Flag**

Acorus gramineus \$12.00

A plant for wet soils, it is perfect for a pond edge or very wet garden spots. It can even be grown in the water. Not a grass, but looks like one with fine foliage that grows to about 12" tall.



# **Bugleweed**

Ajuga reptans 'Burgandy Glow' \$ 12.00

A spreading groundcover with tri-colored leaves. In late spring, spikes of blue flowers bloom but the foliage is the real feature through the summer and fall. It does well in full sun, but it does equally well in the shade of a tree.



#### Allium

Allium 'Bubble Bath' \$ 12.00

This deer-resistant plant features clusters of 3" round light-purple flowers each spring. An ornamental onion, the flowers are smaller than the large bulb-like alliums and the slightly twisted leaves stay attractive through the fall.



#### **Arkansas Blue Star**

Amsonia hubrichtii \$ 12.00

This southern native is attractive in 3 seasons. Blue starshaped flowers bloom in spring and the soft, finely textured leaves just beg to be touched. In fall, the leaves turn a brilliant golden color for an added touch to the autumn garden. Deer resistant





#### **Wild Columbine**

Aquilegia canadensis \$ 12.00

This native plant features red nodding flowers in late April and early May. A short-lived perennial, it will selfseed easily. Naturalizes in wooded/shady conditions. Deer resistant



### **Columbine**

Aquilegia caerulea 'Kirigami' \$ 12.00

These large flowering hybrids of an old-fashioned plant provide bright colors in the late spring garden. They do well in a little bit of shade and enjoy the spring sun. They do well as cut flowers.



## Japanese Spikenard

*Aralia c*. 'Sun King' \$12.00

The large golden compound leaves measure 3 feet long.

This part shade plant wants at least a few hours of sun a day to retain the chartreuse color in its leaves. This deer resistant plant features racines of small white flowers in late summer.



#### **Astilbe**

Astilbe 'Rise and Shine' \$ 12.00

This pink astilbe features 8" long lacy panicles of beefriendly flowers and blooms in early summer. It will get about 27" tall. Can thrive in full sun or full shade so very adaptable to many growing conditions. Deer resistant.



### **Bush Clematis**

Clematis 'Rain Dance' PP33875 \$12.00

This is a non-vining clematis that will grow to 42" so can benefit from staking or a garden obelisk. Indigo blue flowers make a stunning display.





# **Foxglove**

Digitalis purpurea 'Candy Mountain' \$12.00

A classic in any garden. Pink bell-shaped flowers with speckled throats. This 3' tall plant is the natural source for the medicine digitalin. Will take plenty of sun as well.



### **Globe Thistle**

Echinops 'Blue Glow' \$12.00

This well-behaved clumping perennial is topped with intense blue spheres during the summer. It is popular with many pollinators. Grows 30" tall. Makes a good cut flower for arrangements.



## **Cushion Spurge**

Euphorbia polychroma 'Bonfire' PP18585 \$12.00

This 18" tall plant has spectacular foliage for all season color. Leaves emerge purple, red and orange and deepen to burgundy red by summer.



# **Bigroot Geranium**

Geranium macrorrhizum \$12.00

This 12" tall plant will spread 24" wide to make an excellent groundcover. Leaves are aromatic when crushed. Easily grows in average soils. Blooms late spring into summer.



# **Hardy Geranium**

Geranium maculatum 'Rozanne' \$12.00

This hardy geranium hybrid does well in heat and humidity. Blue flowers hover about the sprawling plant, which makes a good ground cover. Does well in full sun and prefers some afternoon shade.





#### Avens

Geum quellyon 'Blazing Sunset' \$12.00

A solid plant for the flower bed. Double scarlet-red flowers grow to 24" tall and will attract pollinators. A good cut flower that is also deer resistant.



# **Leopard Plant**

Ligularia 'Tractor Seat' \$12.00

Massive bold leaves (up to 16" across) make a statement in a mixed planting of flowers. In late summer, golden daisy-like flowers perch over the flowers making a 3' tall showy display. Prefers partial shade. Deer resistant.



### **Cardinal Flower**

Lobelia cardinalis \$12.00

The late-summer spikes of red flowers of this native are a magnet for butterflies, bees, and hummingbirds. It does well in moist or boggy areas or just average soil. Best in partial shade but tolerates full sun. Deer resistant.



### **Great Blue Lobelia**

Lobelia siphilitica \$ 12.00

A wetland native with spikes of blue flowers that attract pollinators in late summer. Naturalizes well in moist sites but can tolerate drought and performs well in a garden flower bed. Plants will self-sow in the right conditions. Deer resistant.



# **Coral Honeysuckle**

Lonicera sempervirens 'Magnifica' \$12.00

This is profuse orange cultivar of the native honeysuckle. A twining vine, it will grow nicely on a fence or trellis and the red flowers attract hummingbirds. Blooms more profusely in full sun but tolerates shade. Grows to about 10' tall.





### **Lance-leaved Loosestrife**

Lysimachia lanceolata 'Burgandy Mist' \$12.00

This is a tough groundcover that is excellent for keeping weeds at bay. Small yellow flowers stand out against dark spiky foliage. Drought tolerant. 1-2' tall and wide.



#### **Bee Balm**

Monarda didyma 'Jacob Cline' \$ 12.00

This native cultivar was selected for its superior resistance to mildew. Large red flowers are a magnet for pollinators and hummingbirds. Blooms from June to August and will get 3-4 feet tall when in flower. Likes full sun and moist conditions but is adaptable and will spread readily.



## Wild Bergamot

Monarda fistulosa \$12.00

An easy to grow native plant that spreads easily. Aromatic foliage supports lavender flowers that attract butterflies and hummingbirds. Perfect in our meadows and for your garden. 30-48" tall.



## **Peony**

Paeonia 'Dr. Alexander Fleming' \$20.00

This peony features double pink flowers. Will grow to about 30" tall and does well with a bit of staking to support the heavy flowers.



### **Peony**

Paeonia 'Festiva Maxima' \$20.00

This classic garden plant is a standard in our garden. Deer resistant, it blooms in late spring. Festiva Maxima has been around for decades and is popular for its white flowers with a carmine eye. Slightly fragrant. It does well in full sun but thrives with some light shade.





## **Peony**

Paeonia 'Karl Rosenfield' \$20.00

This peony features fragrant double fuschia-red flowers. Will grow to about 36" tall and does well with a bit of staking to support the heavy flowers.



# **Black-eyed Susan**

Rudbeckia fulgida 'Goldsturm' \$ 12.00

This native black-eyed Susan is a proven performer in the garden. Strong, long lasting golden flowers provide color all summer long. A great plant for pollinators. If you let the flowers go to seed, it will also attract many birds. Goldfinches cover ours each year. While it will tolerate some shade, it flowers best in full sun.



## **Sweet Coneflower**

Rudbeckia subtomentosa 'Henry Eilers' \$12.00

This variety features finely quilled yellow petals that are stunning. The leaves remain low and the stems can grow over 4' tall. The late summer flowers are excellent for pollinators and birds.



# **Brown-eved Susan**

Rudbeckia triloba \$12.00

This 3'tall flower is excellent for mass planting or naturalizing in a native garden. Popular with pollinators it will bloom in the middle of summer. A short lived perennial, but it seeds freely so more plants will continue to flourish.



#### Rue

Ruta graevolens \$12.00

Dainty yellow flowers bloom above aromatic foliage. Host plant for several swallowtail butterflies. Likes well drained soil and can tolerate dry rocky soil. Grows 2-3' tall and some stems may become woody with age.





## **Woodland Pinkroot**

Spigelia marilandica 'Little Redhead' \$12.00

This summer flowering native is a clump forming perennial that does well in natural areas or a formal garden. Red flowers topped by yellow stars appear in summer. Best in partial or full shade.



## **Betony**

Stachys monieri 'Hummelo' \$12.00

Spikes of lavender-purple flowers grow tall on leafless stems. Basal rosettes of dark green leaves form slowly spreading clumps. Deer resistant.



## **Culver's Root**

Veronicastrum virginicum \$12.00

This native plant features dramatic white spikes growing 4-6' tall. It may be a little slow to get established, but it is a tough long-lasting plant. Very popular with bees, moths and butterflies.

# Perennials for shady spots

These perennials like shade. Need less than 6 hours of direct sun a day. All plants in this section are in 1-gallon pots unless noted otherwise.

#### Anemone

Anemone 'Curtain Call Deep Rose' \$ 12.00

The tall rose-pink flowers of these fall-blooming plants are a perfect addition to a cottage garden where a little shade is present. A nice stop for butterflies in the fall garden. It is deer resistant.



# **Lady Fern**

Athyrium filix-femina var. angustum 'Lady in Red' \$12.00

A 20—30" tall fern with red stems. A vigorous grower that thrives in bright shade and moist soils. Does not tolerate heavy clay soils. Can handle some sun if adequate moisture is provided.



# Siberian Bugloss

Brunnera macrophylla 'Jack Frost' \$ 12.00

We get lots of comments and questions about this plant growing in the Water Garden and Jasmine allee. This cultivar features frosted green leaves and beautiful blue flowers in the spring. Grows 10" high and spreads out about 20"



# Siberian Bugloss

Brunnera macrophylla 'Sterling Silver' \$12.00

This form has more frosting on the larger leaves and is very heat tolerant.





## **Green and Gold**

Chrysogonium virginiana 'Allen Bush' \$12.00

This woodland native groundcover is excellent in filtered shade. Staying low at 8" it can form a nice mat of foliage topped with bright yellow flowers. Good on a path edge.



#### **Lenten Rose**

Helleborus 'Rome in Red' \$ 12.00

Blooming in late winter/early spring, Lenten roses are a welcome sign that spring is on its way. Numerous blossoms of single flowers on each plant provide a variety of colors. Good for naturalizing in shady areas, it will grow 18" tall and gradually spread. Deer resistant.



## **Bear's foot Hellebore**

Helleborus foetidus \$ 12.00

Produces green flowers in late winter/early spring. Good for naturalizing in shady areas, it will grow 18" tall and gradually spread. Foliage is evergreen. Also called stinking hellebore. Deer resistant.



#### **Coral Bells**

Heuchera 'Caramel' \$ 12.00

This cultivar features apricot to amber foliage. Drought tolerant and an excellent plant for the shade. Will get about 18" tall when in bloom. Will spread slowly as a clump and can be divided every few years.



#### **Coral Bells**

*Heuchera* 'Pink Panther \$12.00

This 12" tall cultivar features dark berry pink foliage that makes a great accent in a shady corner. Will spread slowly as a clump and can be divided every few years.





### **Coral Bells**

Heuchera 'Twist of Lime' \$12.00

Bright chartreuse leaves with wavy edges really pop in the shade. Clumps remain low at 12". Will spread slowly as a clump and can be divided every few years.



## **Foamy Bells**

Heucherella 'Copper King' PP35191 \$12.00

This is hybrid between the native Heuchera and Tiarrella. An orange deeply lobed large leaf provides a bright spot in any shady garden. Small white flowers bloom in late spring.



### **Dwarf Crested Iris**

Iris cristata \$12.00

A native shade-loving iris that blooms in early spring. This diminutive plant only reaches 6-8" tall with sword-like leaves and blue-violet blooms. Spreads to form small colonies on the woodland floor.



#### **Cinnamon Fern**

Osmunda cinnamomea \$12.00

A tall (42") vase-shaped fern makes a statement in the shade garden. Does well in part shade to heavy shade. New fronds emerge as vertical cinnamon red brown spikes giving it its common name.



# **Creeping Jacobs Ladder**

Polemonium reptans \$12.00

An easy growing groundcover that does well moist shade and streambanks. The foliage grows about 12" tall and light blue flowers hover above. May go dormant in periods of drought.





### **False Solomon Seal**

Polygonatum odoratum 'Variegatum' \$12.00

A classic plant for the shade garden, with light green variegated foliage that brightens up a dark spot. In late spring, small white bell-shaped flowers dangle under the 18" tall arching stems. This will gradually spread and give you a nice patch of plants.



## Lungwort

Pulmonaria 'Twinkle Toes' \$12.00

This plant is a conversation piece for the shady space. Speckled green leaves make a great foil for other shady plants such as hosta and ferns, while the blue spring flowers provide a pop of color early in the growing season.



#### **Foamflower**

Tiarella cordifolia \$ 12.00

This native woodland plant makes a great groundcover, spreading slowly by stolons. 10" tall white spiky flowers bloom in late spring. Likes plenty of organic matter and consistent moisture.

# **Shrubs for sunny spots**

Shrubs that do well with more than 6 hours of direct sun a day. Most shrubs are in 3-gallon pots.

#### **Abelia**

Abelia x grandiflora 'Little Richard' \$30.00

A compact shrub with glossy green leaves. In the summer fragrant white flowers bloom that provide excellent nectar for bees. Will grow 4' tall and wide. Deer resistant.



## **Red Chokeberry**

Aronia arbutifolia 'Brilliantissima' \$ 30.00

This 8' tall native shrub has white spring flowers and brilliant red fall berries popular with birds. Great for naturalized plantings. Best in full sun but can tolerate some shade. We grow them near the Jasmine Allée.



# **White Beautyberry**

Callicarpa japonica 'Leucocarpa' \$ 20.00

This 6' tall specimen shrub has modest pink flowers in the summer but is known for its brilliant white berries in the fall.



# Carolina Allspice

Calycanthus floridus \$ 30.00

This native shrub will grow 5' high and wide and features fragrant reddish-brown flowers that bloom in spring. Deer resistant. A specimen is growing near the tool shed at the MSV.



# Carolina Allspice

Calycanthus floridus 'Venus' \$35.00

This hybrid is slightly larger (5-7' tall and wide) and features white petals instead of the dark petals of the species. Fragrant.





#### **Blue Mist Shrub**

Caryopteris x clandonensis \$30.00

Blue fragrant flowers attract bees and butterflies in late summer. A low growing deciduous shrub (2-3' tall) that may die back to the ground in severe winters. Can be cut back to maintain shape.



## Chitalpa

Chitalpa 'El Nino' \$35.00

This large shrub/small tree is a hybrid between the desert willow and catalpa. It will get about 8' tall. The dark flowers look like orchids and attracts bees. Tolerates poor soils and dry heat.



## **Summersweet**

Clethra alnifolia 'Ruby Spice' \$30.00

Spikes of fragrant, rose-pink flowers cover this plant in mid-summer. Blooms best in full sun, but naturally grows under larger trees. Does well in moist soils. Shrubs grow about 3-6' tall and 3-4' wide.



## **Summersweet**

Clethra alnifolia 'September Beauty' \$ 30.00

Spikes of fragrant, white flowers cover this plant in midsummer. Blooms best in full sun, but naturally grows under larger trees. Does well in moist soils. Shrubs grow about 3-6' tall and 3-4' wide.



# Red twig dogwood

Cornus sericea 'Baileyi' \$ 30.00

This native shrub naturally grows in low wet areas along lakes and rivers. While it has small white flowers in late spring the red twigs in winter make a spectacular show. It grows about 6' tall and wide and is good for wildlife.





## **Forsythia**

Forsythia x intermedia 'Lynwood Gold' \$30.00

This large shrub will get 6-9' tall and produce larger than normal yellow flowers in early spring. Give it lots of room and enjoy the show.



## Witch Alder

Fothergilla major 'Mt. Airy' \$ 30.00

This native shrub with fragrant white bottlebrush flowers in spring has bright yellow-orange leaves in the fall. Best in a shrub border or foundation planting. Upright growth habit and gets to 6' tall and 4'. Look for them growing in the shrub border behind the Jasmine allee at the MSV.



## **Inkberry**

*Ilex glabra* 'Nigra' \$30.00

An evergreen native holly that remains small (4' tall and wide'). Dark green leaves with black berry-like fruit. Prefers moist soil. Does best in sun but can handle shade.



# Virginia sweetspire

Itea virginica 'Henry's Garnet' \$ 30.00

A cultivar of a native shrub found naturally growing in wet locations. However, has good drought tolerance. Can handle full sun or shade. Spreads gradually and has long fragrant white flowers in late spring/early summer. Great fall foliage. Will get to 4' tall and 5' wide. We have large groupings in Kathie's Spring Garden at the MSV.



# **Grey Owl Juniper**

Juniperus virginiana 'Grey Owl' \$30.00

This cultivar of the native eastern red cedar is relatively low spreading plant (3' tall and 6' wide). Gray foliage is unusual for a red cedar. Drought tolerant when established.





# **Northern Bayberry**

Myrica pensylvanica \$30.00

A dense rounded semi-evergreen shrub that grows 6-8' tall and wide. Can form dense thickets so good for hedges. Small white waxy drupes have been used for making candles, soap, and sealing wax.



### Ninebark

Physocarpus opulifolius 'Summer Wine' \$ 35.00

A rounded shrub that does well in poor soils. It will get 8' tall and wide. The purple foliage is striking, and it will produce pink flowers in late spring. Drought tolerant. We have used it for a hedge in our parking lot, but it makes a great specimen plant as well.



#### **Dwarf Mountain Pine**

Pinus mugo var. pumilio \$35.00

This dwarf form of the Swiss mountain pine will only get 3-5' tall but can grow 6-10' wide. Slow growing with a dense spreading habit and upright branches.



# Elderberry

Sambucus nigra 'Black Lace' \$35.00

A deciduous sprawling shrub that gets 6-8' tall and wide. Can form a colony of plants if in the right place. Pink flowers and dark purple, deeply cut leaves. Fruit is popular with birds and can be used for jams, jellies, and wine.



# Vanhoutte Spirea

Spirea x vanhouttei \$30.00

Also called bridalwreath this is a large (5-8' tall and 7-10' wide) shrub that will have a showy spring bloom. Large graceful branches arch downwards, filled with tiny white flowers.





#### Lilac

Syringa 'Bloomerang Dark Purple' \$35.00

This hybrid was one of the first to be developed to rebloom later in the summer after an initial spring flowering. A classic lilac purple flower will bloom on a shrub that will get 5' tall and wide.



#### Chastetree

Vitex agnus-castus
\$20.00

A 10-15' tall shrub that features the spikes of blue flowers that attracts butterflies and bees all summer long. May die back to the ground in severe winters but will grow back easily. Deer resistant.



# Shrubs for shady spots

Shrubs that are happy with less than six hours of direct sunlight Most shrubs are in 3-gallon pots

# Hydrangea

*Hydrangea macrophylla* 'Nikko Blue' \$25.00

This classic garden hydrangea features large globe-like blue flowers in mid-summer. Can grow 6' tall and wide and deer resistant.



# **Reblooming Hydrangea**

*Hydrangea macrophylla x serrata* 'Let's Dance Sky View' \$35.00

A reblooming hybrid that features a classic blue bloom. Will produce flowers through the summer. Compact and good for containers as it will get only 3-4' tall and wide.



## Oakleaf hydrangea

Hydrangea quercifolia 'Alice' \$ 30.00

This native cultivar produces large white cone-shaped flowers. The oak-shaped leaves turn a bright burgundy in the fall for added interest. It will get 5' wide and tall. One is growing in the shade of the Pink Pavilion.



## Oakleaf hydrangea

Hydrangea quercifolia 'Gatsby Pink' \$ 35.00

This oakleaf features pink flowers. It will get 6-8' wide and tall.

### Flame Azalea

Rhododendron calendulaceum \$ 40.00

An upright, loosely branched deciduous shrub that is native to woodland slopes in the Appalachian mountains. Yellow to orange flowers in spring. Will get 4-8' tall.



#### Rhododendron

Rhododendron catawbiense 'Roseum Elegans' \$ 40.00

This native to the mountains of southern Virginia, this evergreen shrub grows 6-8' tall and wide. Rosy lavender flowers bloom above large, glossy, dark green leaves.



#### **Doublefile Viburnum**

Viburnum plicatum var. tomentosum 'Shasta' \$ 30.00

A broad spreading shrub that will get 6-7' tall but as wide as 10'. Large white lace-cap flowers top horizontal branches in the spring. Great fall color. Excellent for hedges or specimen plants. Does well in part shade but also in full sun.

### **Trees**

# **Dwarf Japanese Maple**

Acer palmatum 'Tamukeyama' \$145.00

This weeping red cutleaf maple is one of the best for holding its color through the season. This selection has been grown for more than 300 years in Japan. Two 5' tall trees are available in 7-gallon pot.



### **Red Maple**

Acer rubrum 'October Glory' \$ 150.00

This female cultivar is best known for its spectacular orange-red fall foliage that lasts longer than other maples. Fast growing, it can reach 50' tall with a spread of 40'. 2 trees are available in 15-gallon container, 9' tall.



# **Allegheny Serviceberry**

Amelanchier laevis \$85.00

A small understory tree getting only 15-25' tall. Showy white flowers with round edible fruit that are good for pies, jellies, and jams – if you can beat the birds to them. 5 trees available in 7-gallon container.



# Serviceberry

*Amelanchier x grandiflora* 'Autumn Brilliance' \$110.00

A hybrid between downy serviceberry and Allegheny serviceberry, this is a small multi-trunked understory tree. Showy white flowers in the spring, edible fruit and bright color in the fall make this a great tree for multiple seasons. Two 8' tall trees are available, root balls covered in burlap.





### **River Birch**

*Betula nigra* 'Heritage' \$120.00

A vigorous, fast-growing tree that can reach more than 40' tall. Adaptable to a variety of situations - it grows in wetlands but can tolerate dry soils. This cultivar is heat tolerant. Two 8' tall trees available in 10 gallon containers.



## **Fringetree**

Chionanthus virginicus \$85.00

A native small tree that grows 12-20' tall and wide. Also known as grancy graybeard. Very adaptable to soil types and grows best in full sun. White flowers in spring look like shredded petals and nice yellow leaves in the fall. 3 plants are available in 7-gallon containers.



## **Dogwood**

Cornus florida f. 'Cherokee Princess' \$85.00

A vigorous disease resistant selection of the native understory tree. The classic white dogwood with good fall color, it is perfect for the home garden. Can grow 30' tall and 25' wide. 3 plants are available in 7-gallon containers.



# **Sweet Bay**

Magnolia virginiana \$ 85.00

A small to medium tree that will grow 20-35' tall and wide. Native to Virginia's coastal plain and piedmont. Extremely fragrant white flowers in early summer. Great specimen tree for the garden or can tolerate wet soils. Semi-evergreen in the Winchester area. 3 plants are available in 7-gallon containers.





# **American Hop-hornbeam**

Ostrya virginiana \$195.00

A slow growing slender deciduous tree that can get 20-40' tall. Adaptable to a variety of settings it does well in an urban garden. The fruit can resemble hops and is popular with birds. Host plant for the eastern tiger swallowtail butterfly. Two trees are available, 12' tall with root ball covered in burlap.



### **Corkscrew Willow**

Salix matsudana \$35.00

A 20-30' tall tree with a rounded crown. Stems are twisted and contorted for excellent winter interest or cutting and putting in floral arrangements. Fast growing and does well around water. 2 plants in 3-gallon containers.
