ABOUT THIS YEAR'S PICTURE:

Color or paint this picture that celebrates the 30th anniversary of First Night Winchester and the special MSV exhibition *And Still We Rise: African American Story Quilts*. This exhibition presents 69 works of textile art that illustrate significant moments in African American History. A traveling exhibition on view in the MSV through December 31, 2016, *And Still We Rise* is presented by the Women of Color Quilters Network in partnership with the Cincinnati Museum Center and the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center. The exhibition is sponsored locally by BB&T and Shenandoah Country Q102 and presented at the MSV in collaboration with the Winchester Area NAACP.



ABOUT THE QUILT IN THE COLORING SHEET:



This year's First Night coloring sheet includes a drawing of the story quilt *Paul Robeson as Othello on Broadway*. Made in 2012 by Glenda Richardson of Maryland and featured in the *And Still We Rise* exhibition, the quilt celebrates African American actor Paul Robeson. Featuring Robeson in the title role, the Shubert Theatre production of *Othello* opened in 1943. With more than 280 performances, the show would go on to break the record for the most number of consecutive performances of any Shakespearian production on Broadway.
